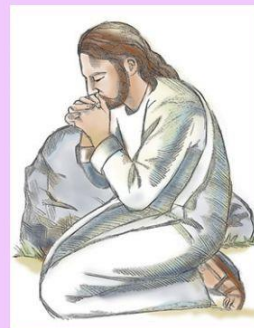

Mission Statement:

The St. Matthew & Shepherd of the Hills Religious Education Program will strive to nourish parishioners through human, spiritual, intellectual, and pastoral formation. Our goal is to effectively engage people of all ages to foster thriving relationships with Jesus Christ and to be boldly Catholic, rooted in the Sacraments, witnessing to the power of Jesus through radically leading lives of service, prayer, study, and community.

Goals:

- To foster students' spiritual growth in their Catholic faith.
- To provide students with an enduring understanding of the Scriptures, creed, justice & morality, prayer and the history of our Catholic Church.
- To offer youth the tools needed for integrating faith into everyday life throughout their journeys.
- To offer your child another faithful adult connection in the Church.

Parents' Role

- **You have the most important role in your child's life! We cannot do this without you!**
- **You are the primary educator** for your child(ren) in all areas of faith formation
 - Weekly Mass attendance with your child(ren)
 - Frequently receiving the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist
 - Attend Family Nights with your children
- Come alongside the staff and volunteer catechists to **be partners in your child's faith formation**
- **Read and reply to communications** that come from the SMC/SOTH Religious Ed program
- **Engage your own faith** as a model for your child(ren)
- Ask staff questions or request support for areas of interest that you have as a parent
- Register to help our religious education program at class, at an event or in the Coffee Shop

Registration and Fees

Payment for the 2024-2025 program year is \$100/child *plus* sacrament fees.

There is a maximum base fee (before sacramental costs) of \$300 per family for members of either parish.

1 student = \$100 2 students = \$200 3+ students = \$300

Non-members have a per child fee of \$120; not to exceed \$360 per family.

On the registration, please choose some ways your family can commit to helping:

- Religious Ed Teacher, Aide, Hallway Monitor or Substitute Catechist
- Work in the Coffee Shop at SOTH on Sundays (8-Noon) with your child
- Help plan & host the Santa Breakfast (SMC) or Mardi Gras (SOTH)
- Supervise Night Drop-offs and Pick-ups on Mondays/Wednesdays

- Help with Family Nights or Youth Group Nights
- Sponsor Treats for Family Nights (2-3 times/year on M/W)
- Sponsor High School Session snacks (Sun after SOTH's 8:15 Mass-11:15AM)

Payments should be made in the form of a check or cash.

Checks can be mailed to your parish office marked "Attn: Rel ed fees" or sent with the child on the first night of class.

*Catechists, full time aides and hall monitors get 1 child free (-\$100 from your total)

Payment plans are available. Financial aid is available. No family will be turned away due to inability to pay. Any financial assistance will be kept confidential. Please contact Dawn Doll with requests for assistance.

Scrip profits from July 2023-June 2024 can be applied towards a family's account. Use Scrip at SOTH/SMC to apply your proceeds to the next Rel Ed Program Year.

In Case of Inclement Weather:

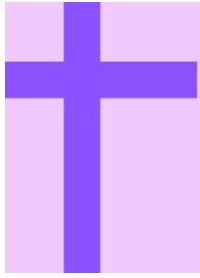
In-person gatherings will be cancelled at least 2 hours in advance.

Families will be notified through the One Call Now alert system. Event cancellations will always include a text, phone call, and email notification.

- Please be sure all necessary phone numbers are receiving text messages for cancellations; if a caregiver's number needs to be added, please contact Dawn Doll.

If the Campbellsport School District calls off school or has an early release due to weather, there will be no Religious Education events that evening.

Note: There may be Religious Education events on nights when Campbellsport Schools have no scheduled classes; in that case, Religious Education events will still be held.



St. Matthew & Shepherd of the Hills Elementary/Middle School Program

Days & Locations: Mondays at Shepherd of the Hills OR Wednesday at St. Matthew

Time: 6:15 – 7:30 pm on scheduled Religious Education class nights

Program Goals:

- Engage families in their faith so they might grow closer to God together
- Provide faith-centered activities to families to make growing together in faith easier
- Create strategies so that this Word can be communicated to & encountered by the participants
- Proclaim the Gospel in an effective way to participants
- Help participants come to a deeper personal understanding and assimilation of the faith message
- Help participants apply their faith to everyday life
- Celebrate with prayerful gratitude and praise to God for His Word and each other

Curriculum:

All grades (1st - 8th) will have access to **Family Faith Points**, where children will win prizes for completing activities at home each week and month.

NEW! Family Nights will take place 2-3 times per academic year; parents are expected to attend with their children, including older children. There will be activities for the whole family, plus activities for each age group during those nights.

Grade 2: Preparation for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion

In class, we will use *Reconciliation: Pardon & Peace* and *Eucharist: We Give Thanks and Praise*.

At home, *Making Things Right* and *Called to His Supper* will be used to supplement sacramental learning in the classroom and encourage parental participation. (More details will be provided at the 2nd Grade Parent Meeting in September)

Grades 1, 3-8: We will utilize Word of Life curriculum, which includes both print and digital editions of the student text, along with parent and family faith formation.

The focus of each grade is as follows.

- Grade 1: God's Promise of a Savior
- Grade 3: Holy Spirit and Life of Grace
- Grade 4: The Creed: Truth and our Response of Faith

- Grade 5: Liturgy and Worship
- Grade 6: The Word of God: Jesus Christ and Sacred Scripture
- Grade 7: The Moral Life in Christ
- Grade 8: The Saints and Doctors of the Church; plus start logging Service Hours for Confirmation



Goals:

- Teens feel encouraged to deepen and develop a personal relationship with Jesus, and the Catholic Church by asking questions learning church teachings etc. evident with evaluations and feedback gathered from High School Sessions.
- Teens are joyfully sharing their time and talents as they witness to the parish communities of St. Matthew & Shepherd of the Hills Evident with teens actively at Masses and parish events.
- Teens and families are invested and involved in parish events visible with volunteer positions filled.
- Have a larger number of Adult Small Group Leaders on Sunday High School Sessions who genuinely care about teens and know the teen’s jobs, hobbies, worries, dreams, and questions about the faith.

Tentative Timeline for a High School Sunday Session:

8:15AM: **Attend Mass** sitting with your family, as a group of teens, or as a small group with your small group leader.

9:15AM Go into the School Gym after Mass for a Large Group gathering with Youth Minister Anna Kraus leading prayer/ announcements etc.

9:20AM Small Groups in Classrooms

- Attendance
- Share high & low of your week
- Prayer
- Challenge from past Session is reviewed
- Current videos, topic, or lesson

11:00 Closing of Small Groups

- Set new challenges
- Unpack any questions
- Write down follow up tasks/concerns for Youth Minister Anna Kraus
- Share more personal prayer intentions, bond as a group

11:15 in the Gym for Large Group ending prayer, final announcements & dismissal by Anna Kraus

If you must miss a High School Session:

1. Know that you are missed! You are needed to have small group conversations.
2. We want to help hold you accountable as you prioritize your faith life thus...
3. We ask that the following is completed if a session is missed.

 - The make-up assignment is a reflection paper of 300+ words on something from our FORMED platform (filled with great Catholic content).
 - Make-up papers are due by the next Sunday of class.

 - WHAT TO REFLECT ON: In AT LEAST 300 words make-up assignments should address at least two of the points below about some podcast, movie, audio file, episode, talk, or other Formed content related to faith.
 - Why did this media from FORMED stand out to you?
 - Is this FORMED media something you have heard of before about the Catholic faith?
 - How is this media from FORMED related to something from your class bookwork?
 - Why is this media from FORMED something people should listen to or not listen to?

High School Annual Events:

- Each 9th-11th grader is to attend the High School Sessions immediately following the *Shepherd of the Hills* 8:15 Mass until 11:15am
- One Adoration & Reconciliation Session
- One Safe Environment Education Session
- **NEW! Attend 1 of the Family Nights hosted on Mondays (SOTH) or Wednesdays (SMC) in a year during the 1st-8th grade RE Class times so 6:15pm-7:30pm with your entire family or as much of your family as possible more details in the Elementary/ Middle School Section of the handbook**
- MUST help with Religious Education Department fundraising events, which include:
 - Faris Popcorn: all checks go to St. Matthew & popcorn will be picked up at St. Matthew Fall typically Oct. Nov.
 - Santa Breakfast: St. Matthew on a Sunday morning in December
 - Mardi Gras Dinner on the Sat. before Ash Wednesday at Shepherd of the Hills
 - Coffee House: Most Sundays 8am-12pm at Shepherd of the Hills
- When in your Confirmation years... teens schedule an interview with their sponsor and Youth Minister, Anna Kraus, via *video call* or *in-person*.

Also Annually: ALL 9th, 10th, and 11th graders will focus on the following areas and be responsible for tracking/submitting the following:

- Complete at least 2 service experiences (Community or Parish) in the Summer/Fall of each year of high school.
- Write a service reflection essay about their Summer/Fall serving that is due in December of the current year.
- High School teens are required to do 15 parish & 15 community services hours by Confirmation (30 total hours over the course of three years).
 - Since these hours should be served within the parish and within the community. Reach out to your school guidance office for service opportunities in your community,
 - Parish & Community Hours are *recommended* to be spread out throughout Freshman, Sophomore, and Junior Year (approx. 10 hours/year)
 - A standard rule of thumb is that service is helping others without compensation (being paid) for an action that you are not otherwise expected to do.
 - Common Examples of Service
 - Serving, greeting, or being a lector at Mass
 - Helping an elderly neighbor
 - Assisting in a parish or parish school brunch/dinner/ festival/picnic
 - Serving on a Mission trip

- Assisting with yard work for someone outside your immediate family
 - Babysitting for a friend unpaid (not your immediate family)
 - Coaching, assisting coaching, or working concessions.
- The Service Hour E-Form on myreligioused.com must be used to track the service hours.
 - No signed paper form will be accepted.
 - E-Form helps us track efficiently as it auto populates into an excel document

Confirmation Year Information:

- Attend High School Sessions 2/month (if SMSA see section below)
- PRIOR to receiving the Sacrament, parents contact the child's baptismal parish & request an official copy of their Baptismal Certificate
 - Must be sent to Shepherd of the Hills Religious Ed office.
 - Copy must contain the Parish Seal.
 - If Baptized at St. Matthew or Shepherd, no copy needed – only give the date of the baptism.
- Choose a Saint Name
- Choose a Sponsor
- Attend the Confirmation Retreat (typically in the Fall).
- Pre-confirmation interview with confirmation candidate, sponsor, and Anna Kraus
- Required paperwork and event for confirmation year:
 - Parent Only meeting (Sept.)
 - Confirmation form with sponsor info. (due Sept.)
 - Interview with sponsor sheet (due Sept.)
 - Confirmation Retreat (A retreat must be attended) (Nov.)
 - NEW! Confirmation Retreat Day Dinner (With Parent or Sponsor) (Nov.)
 - Service paper (due Dec.)
 - Letter/Short Answer Form for the Bishop (due Jan.)
 - Pre-Confirmation interview with Anna & Sponsor (due March.)

SMSA Confirmation Preparation:

- Please, register all years 9th-11th
- **NEW! Attend 1 of the Family Nights hosted 2 Mondays (SOTH) or 2 Wednesdays (SMC) a year during the 1st-8th grade RE Class times (6:15pm-7:30pm)**
- SMSA Grade 9 - Dec. Service paper help serve parish/ Religious Education events
- SMSA Grade 10
 - Start independent Decision Point book

- Dec. Service Paper
- Email Anna thoughts about a Confirmation Saint Name & your Sponsor
- SMSA Grade 11
 - Finish Decision Point book
 - Meet for discussions with Anna a few times during the year at SMSA after school.
 - Same as above required Confirmation section, but SMSA are not required to attend the 2 Sundays a month general formation sessions

Why Youth Ministry? Optional Youth Ministry activities and evenings gives your teen the chance to dive deeper into their faith because they want to, not because they are "required to" attend formation classes. Youth Ministry helps grow the Body of Christ by preparing future leaders.

Parent Expectations Encourage your son or daughter to participate in Youth Ministry activities but please do not force them to do so. Respect your son or daughter if they say no when you ask them to go- but know that a "no" one week might turn into a "yes" the next session. What makes Youth Ministry fun for teens is that everyone that attends wants to be there.

Activities Some optional activities for teens of SMC and SOTH. Some of these activities may include: Flannel Night, Hawaiian Night, Video Game Night, Summer Mission Trip, Trivia Night, Movie Night, Board Game Night, Open Gym, Mission Trip fundraising service activities, and much more.

Typical Youth Group schedule is:

6:00-6:15 - Hangout in usually the St. Matthew's gym

- Wait for people to arrive!
- Enter via the Mill St. Gym Doors
- If hosted at Shepherd or King Pin Lanes etc. then the month's flier will explain

6:15 - Eat a sweet treat or Dinner depending on the plan that month (monthly flier will explain)

6:45 - Table activity (could be card games, service activity, new prayer etc.)

7:00 - Bible Study of the Gospel for upcoming weekend OR a Faith filled discussion about the current liturgical season etc.

7:15-8:15 - Gym Time/ GAMES / Teen Lead activity (ie we made slime once!)

8:15-8:30 - Closing Prayer & pick up time

RSVP to ANNA at least 48 hours before please! (The Tuesday before the Youth Group Thursday)
